



## Student Graduation Rates

The Department of Education requires the disaggregated reporting of student graduation rates. The data is based on our first-time, full-time, first-year baccalaureate-seeking cohort which typically represents less than 12% of our overall student enrollment. The data below represents the graduation rates of the cohort who entered Viterbo in the Fall of 2014. The summary of graduation rates by type of Title IV aid, gender, race and ethnicity are shown below.
