<sup>3</sup>Research Methods options include PSYC 230 and PSYC 330 Research Methods I and II or SOWK 240 Introduction to Research and Analytic Writing and SOCL 338 Social Science Research. Students MUST choose one of these options—the courses may not be taken individually from two different tracks.
