### **First-Time, First-Year Student Retention Rates**

#### Entering Cohorts of First-Time, Full-Time, Degree-Seeking, Undergraduate Students

The retention rates are based on the first-time, full-time, degree-seeking undergraduate cohort groups. In alignment with the National Center for Education Statistics, exclusions from the cohort groups are allowed for military activations or deployments, deaths, and permanent disabilities. The retention rate for a given time interval is computed by dividing the number of students from the originally enrolled group who were registered or graduated after that given time interval by the number in the group when originally enrolled, taking into account exclusions at that time. For example, the 3<sup>rd</sup> semester retention rate for the Fall 2022 cohort (70%) is the percentage of the full-time, first-time, freshmen who entered Viterbo in Fall 2022 (235) and were enrolled at Viterbo at census date of Fall 2023 (164).



Exclusions from the cohort groups are allowed for military activations or deployments, deaths, and permanent disabilities. Rates are calculated for completed years only, including Fall, Spring and Summer terms. For example,the 6-year graduation rate for the Fall 2017 cohort is the percentage of the full-time, first-time, freshmen who entered Viterbo in Fall 2017 and graduated from Viterbo by the end of Summer 2023.




### **Transfer Retention Rates**

#### **Entering Fall Cohorts of Undergraduate, Degree-Seeking, Transfer Students**

The retention rates are based on the degree-seeking undergraduate students who entered Viterbo University as transfer students in the fall terms. In alignment with the National Center for Education Statistics, exclusions from the groups are allowed for military activations or deployments, deaths, and permanent disabilities. The retention rate for a given time interval is computed by dividing the number of students from the original cohort who were enrolled in or graduated within the given time interval, by the Adjusted Cohort number. For example, the 3rd semester retention rate for the Fall 2022 cohort (82%) is the percentage of the transfer students who entered Viterbo in Fall 2022 (130) and were enrolled at Viterbo at census date of Fall 2023 (107).



Rates are calculated for completed years only, including Fall, Spring and Summer terms. For example, the four-year graduation rate of 69% for the Fall 2017 transfer cohort is the percentage of the transfer students who entered Viterbo in Fall 2017 and graduated from Viterbo by the end of Summer 2021.






