Estimated Costs Per Year

Based on 12 undergraduate contact hours; six graduate contact hours (actual cost may vary depending upon hours enrolled and courses chosen.) Includes tuition, fees, on-campus housing, meal plan, health insurance, books, and supplies.

Scholarships

First-year undergraduates may qualify for academic scholarships up to \$20,000 per year based upon their secondary GPA. Transfer undergraduate students may receive academic scholarships up to \$10,000 per year. There may also be opportunities for athletic and/or departmental scholarships.
