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PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Viterbo's Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology (MSSLP) program prepares students with the academic and practical experience needed to work as a certified speech-language pathologist. Our 59-credit hour program takes two years to complete with a mix of face-to-face coursework and clinical experiences in area health care facilities and schools. The MSSLP program covers a range of topics related to communication disorders and their treatment, including speech, language, social communication, cognitive-communication, and swallowing disorders. The program provides a solid understanding of deaf culture and the needs of diverse

communities. Students also, under the supervision of a ASHA certified speech language pathologist, obtain clinical experience assessing and treating communication disorders while also developing a professional network within the field.

Financial Aid

Apply for Admission

All applicants must apply through the Centralized Application Service for Communication Science and Disorders (CSDCAS). To apply for this program, applicants must have completed a BS/BA in communications disorders or completed a post-baccalaureate certificate designed for entry into a speech-language pathology program, and have met the following requirements:

- Cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale
- Provide three letters of recommendation
- Essay (2 page/estimate). Find essay question in supplemental items list in application portal
- Submission of official transcript from all degree-granting institutions and institutions where pre-enrollment courses were complete.
